Behaviour:

As the incoming Headteacher to St Peter's I would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone of the high expectations that myself, and the rest of my team has for how children treat one another in school. Every child has the right to feel safe, respected and included, and we celebrate the diversity within our school community.

This means that no child should ever be treated unkindly or unfairly because of who they are, including their age, disability, gender, race, religion or belief, or any other protected characteristic. Our school has a zero tolerance approach to any forms of behaviour which cause hurt or harm or infringes on a child's right in line with the Equality Act 2010. When incidents occur, they are taken seriously, dealt with promptly and followed up—ensuring all children feel supported.

Alongside this, we are continuing to teach children about respect, kindness and equality through our curriculum and collective worship, with a particular focus on learning about protected characteristics and the importance of valuing differences. We encourage parents and carers to support this work at home by talking to your children about treating others with fairness and empathy, and by reinforcing the importance of standing up against unkind behaviour.

Together, we can ensure our school remains a safe and welcoming place where every child thrives.
