Ofsted Monitoring Report

We were pleased too be able to share the recent findings from the latest monitoring report this week; whilst we still continue to be a school classed as needing special measures, the report highlighted the huge improvements made across all areas over the last term.

Most importantly, safeguarding is now effective. The inspectors noted that practice has been significantly strengthened and is firmly embedded in a positive whole-school culture. Training is regular and purposeful, and safeguarding is part of everyday practice. Leaders know pupils and families well, maintain strong oversight, work effectively with external agencies and communicate clearly with parents and carers. This represents a major improvement since the last inspection and ensures that pupils' safety and wellbeing are a clear priority.

The inspectors noted that leadership in school, the Trust and through the governing body was now effectively strengthened and that this is having a positive effect on enabling the school to make rapid progress.

Teaching and learning is improving and inspectors noted that learning environments are increasingly orderly and well organised. Inclusion has also moved forward. Inspectors recognised clearer systems to support inclusive practice, underpinned by established SEND leadership and a shared approach to teaching. Classroom routines are calmer and more consistent, creating better conditions for learning.

This is all testament to the hard work of everyone involved in the school, including our families, so a massive thank you to everyone for their continued support and commitment to St Peter's. The full report is available on the website.

Pol-Ed PSHE Trial

This summer term, our school is trialling Pol-Ed, a PSHE resource developed with West Yorkshire Police. Pol-Ed provides age-appropriate lessons on topics such as personal safety, healthy relationships, online behaviour and community awareness. The aim is to strengthen our safeguarding curriculum and support pupils in developing the knowledge and skills they need to stay safe and make positive choices.

We will review the trial at the end of term and gather feedback from staff and pupils before deciding on next steps.

PSHE & RSE Parent Consultation

A parent consultation on our PSHE and RSE curriculum will be shared soon. All schools must teach Relationships Education and Health Education as part of their statutory duty, and parents are consulted when schools review their RSE policy. The consultation will outline what is taught in each year group and give families the chance to share their views and ask questions.
